In poetry of Hafiz some of the traditional similes and metaphors lose their strength and suitability. Khayyam and Hafiz have compared God to a painter, but the comparison made by Khayyam is stronger and more beautiful than what Hafiz has done. The followings are good examples of such comparisnos:

In the following poems we can see instances of comparison from Ferdowsi and Hafiz. The former has compared the sun to someone who is carring a flag in hand. It suits the poem because the style is epic and one is thinking of the war and battle field. But the latter has used the same comparison when he is talking about love and as the result the reader is thinking of love and thus the "flag in hand" is not a suitable simile.

The Development and Decadence of Simile and Metaphor in the Poetry of Hafiz*

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1. The Development of Simile and Metaphor in the Poetry of Hafiz.

The traditional similes and metaphors change so much in the poetry of Hafiz that every reader thinks that they are invented by him. Possibly, the readers are right because Hafiz, in giving the same simile and metaphor, has added his own colours. In doing so, he has made them much more meaningful, musical, beautiful, new and perfect. The followings are some traditional similes which are used by Hafiz:

Here he compares the straightness of the body to a cypress tree.

Here he likens the lover to a candle.

Here he compares the darkness and the odour of the hair of the beloved to ambergris.
